## **“Perioperative Cardiovascular Bad Outcomes: How to Recognize, Manage and Prevent Them”**

**Jeffrey Luebbert, MD** is a Clinical Cardiac Electrophysiologist at the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania. He is an assistant professor of medicine and the assistant director of the electrophysiology laboratory at Pennsylvania Hospital. His practice is focused on the diagnosis, management and follow up of all arrhythmias as well as the management of cardiac implantable electronic devices.

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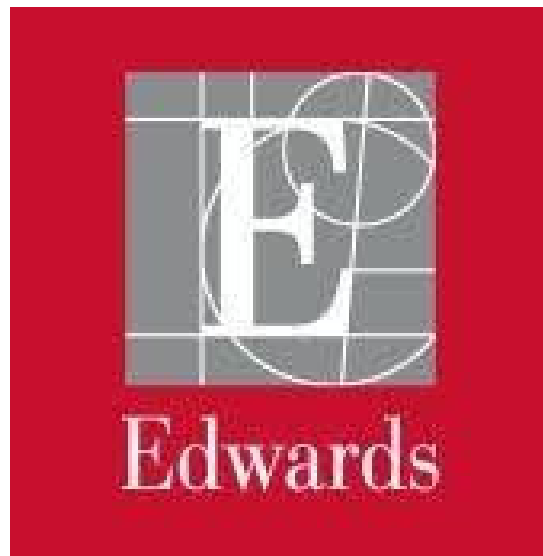

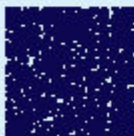
